A Jewish Composers Showcase*. It was a delightful concert and very well done. Our congregational second-night seder was also a success. We said: *Next year in Jerusalem; Next year in the Temple*. From the President

Dear B'er Chayim Congregation,

I trust that everyone had a happy, healthy Passover. It seems like during this Passover we could truly identify with the plight of the Hebrews of ancient Egypt. During those times the Jewish people were held as hostages and enslaved by Pharaoh. During the past year and a half, we have also lost many of our everyday freedoms and have been held hostage by this devastating pandemic. Similarly, as with Moses and the ancient Hebrew people, we have used our perseverance and ingenuity to deliver us from this terrible time in our history. Like the miracle of the parting of the Red Sea, we have again been able to witness a modern-day miracle. Mankind has summoned all its resources to develop Coronavirus vaccines with lightning quickness, like we have never seen before. As during the time of Pharaoh, a miracle has occurred that promises to restore life to some state of normalcy.

Although some rather abstract parallels have been drawn here, I am sure, that as with the Hebrews in ancient Egypt, we have also learned to be thankful for the basic freedoms that life gives us, freedoms that we sometimes take for granted. It also makes us more appreciative of the smaller things in life, such as going to temple for a community Seder or for Shabbat services. The Board felt that with the reduction in Covid-19 cases in our area and the increased number of vaccinations, it would be prudent to reopen B'er Chayim.

Congregants who choose to attend services in person will still be required to wear masks while in the building. B'er Chayim will also still practice social distancing as well as check temperatures at the door. For those of you who either cannot attend, or don't feel comfortable attending in person, we will continue using Zoom. Cantor Bessman and the B'er Chayim Board all look forward to seeing you at Temple.


