- Sunday, March 28, 6:30 pm. Community ZOOM Seder. I know you know that! There will be a five-minute break in the middle of the service, so plan on eating before if you like (minus the matzah). The ceremony should be finished around 8:00 pm. We are using: A Passover Haggadah, the CCAR publication edited by Herbert Bronstein. There are several copies in the office. If you need to borrow a copy or two, just give us a call. Lawrence A. Hoffman's Historical Introduction on pages 9-12 answers many questions about why we do what we do (and why it is when we do it). There are only four pages of terrific background information to read.
- And though it matters not for this week, we will be reopening the building for services next week. Saturday, April 3rd, is the day. 10:00 am the time. We continue with Zoom, meaning you have two options on how to attend. The same safeguards will be used that were in place last year to ensure the safety of those who choose to come in person.

Parashat Tzav is the Torah portion for this week. In it are the sacrificial obligations—described in somewhat graphic detail—commanded (tzav) to Aaron through Moses by God. As a vegan, I'm not sure how to appreciate it all. I'm sorry we aren't having Torah study this Saturday for me to hear your perspective. Fortunately, it will come up again

Tzav

Command [Aaron and His Sons]

Leviticus 6:1-8:36

The Eternal One spoke to Moses, saying: "Command Aaron and his sons thus: This is the ritual of the burnt offering: The burnt offering itself shall remain where it is burned upon the altar all night until morning, while the fire on the altar is kept going on it." - Leviticus 6:1

Summary

- The five sacrifices that the priests are to perform are described. (6:1-7:38)
- Limitations on the consumption of meat are delineated. (7:17-27)
- Details about the ordination of Aaron and his sons as priests and the preparation of the Tabernacle as a holy place are given. (8:1-36)
