My central takeaway is that disenfranchisement is not good for any group. The history of the Jewish people-most notably 20th-century European Jewish history -teaches that rights once thought secure are indeed transitory. Dr. David Sorkin, one of several excellent speakers attending, was quick and unequivocal when questioned if we need to be concerned as Jews with respect to our rights in the United States. Yes. In our lifetimes, many of us saw signs declaring that blacks and Jews were not allowed. In our lifetimes, many of us personally experienced blatant discrimination. The last 40 years-not so much. Recent memory can be easily forgotten.

As it seems to be with those who followed Moses. Parashat Eikev continues the retelling of our ancestors' desert journey. Again, words from this parashah can be found in our canon of prayers.

As a descendent of Moses (in spirit, if not in fact), let me continue the tradition of repetition as I remind everyone that you can find current information on the temple website, Berchayim.org. Not only are the recent Shabbat Updates and the monthly Bulletin archived there, but also the Calendar tab reveals future events. It is a good place to start even though the information there may be, as most things in life, "subject to change."

Eikev

עֵקֶב

[And if You] Obey [These Rules] Deuteronomy 7:12–11:25

Summary

- Moses tells the Israelites that if they follow God's laws, the nations who now dwell across the Jordan River will not harm them. (7:12–26)
- Moses reminds the people of the virtues of keeping God's commandments. He also tells them that they will dispossess those who now live in the Land only because they are idolatrous, not because the Israelites are uncommonly virtuous. Thereupon, Moses reviews all of the trespasses of the Israelites against God. (8:1–10:11)
- Moses says that the Land of Israel will overflow with milk and honey if the people obey God's commandments and teach them to their children. (10:12– 11:25)
