## Cantor Bessman's Shabbat Update

Dear BCT Membership,

Shoftim (judges) is concerned with fundamentals of law, sacred and secular. "Justice, justice you shall pursue" is one of the more familiar five-word phrases that may be heard in Jewish circles. These words begin the third verse of this week's parashah, which ends with the carrot: "that you may live and possess the land the Lord your God is giving you

(Deuteronomy 16:20)." The stick, we have seen on numerous occasions.

The pursuit of justice becomes a core Jewish value, the intricacies of which are explained at length in the Talmud. Nevertheless, many of the Biblical passages we read this week are stated with a self-evident meaning: bribery blinds the eyes of the wise (16:19); thoroughly investigate crimes (17:4); capital crimes require significant proof (17:6); respect the judgment of the court (17:11, for the court is just—as it answers to God, as should also the king (17:19-20)); and, you shall not pull back your neighbor's landmark (thereby stealing land, 19:14). Then we come to an oft-repeated Old Testament trope: "You shall not have pity: life for life, eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot (19:21)." Now, we do need the Talmud to help us explain. All the above is remarkable in that you may hear such concepts in today's U.S. courtrooms. Well, maybe not so much the last phrase, though the Talmud makes clear that "eye for eye" is not literally a physical retribution, but financial compensation. This would be heard in the halls of justice.

In less than two weeks, we have the "welcome back" in-person weekend, outside in beautiful surroundings and fresh air. Shabbat Under the Stars at the Bel Air Pavilion takes place on Friday, August 20. Our congregational picnic is two days later, on Sunday, August 22, at Constitution Park. Hope to see you there.

This Friday, services are at the regular time (7:30 pm) and at the regular place (BCT and Zoom).

**Deuteronomy 16:18–21:9** 

#### **Summary**

- Laws regarding both sacred and secular legislation are addressed.
   The Israelites are told that in every dealing they should pursue justice in order to merit the land that God is giving them. (16:18–18:8)
- The people are warned to avoid sorcery and witchcraft, the abhorrent practices of their idolatrous neighbors. (18:9–22)
- God tells them that should an Israelite unintentionally kill another, he may take sanctuary in any of three designated cities of refuge. (19:1–13)
- Laws to be followed during times of peace and times of war are set forth. (19:14–21:9)
