year, I noted that most of Jacob's children are chronicled here. Eleven of the leaders for the (12) tribes of Israel are named. The number "twelve" is easier to remember than the actual names, much less the different mothers (and birth order of the sons). I usually remember the specifics for only a couple of monthsthat's one reason why an annual revisiting of Torah portions is so fruitful. It is a mishigas of a family. Leah begins with Reuben (1), Simon (2), Levi (3), Judah (4); Rachel's maidservant Bilhah births Dan (5), Naphtali (6); now Leah's maidservant Zilpah adds Gad (7), Asher (8); back to Leah with Issachar (9), Zebulun (10); at long last Rachel's first, named Joseph (11); and next week her number two, Benjamin (12) finally arrives. Other things happen in Vayeitzei. Please come Friday night to find out.

Thursday, November 25, Thanksgiving. Unfortunately, there is no interfaith Thanksgiving get-together due to ongoing COVID concerns.

Genesis 28:10–32:3

Summary

- Jacob dreams of angels going up and down a ladder. God blesses him. Jacob names the place Bethel. (28:10-22)
- Jacob works seven years in order to marry Rachel, but Laban tricks Jacob into marrying Leah, Rachel's older sister. (29:16-25)
- Jacob marries Rachel but only after having to commit himself to seven more years of working for Laban. (29:26-30)
- Leah, Rachel, and their maidservants, Bilhah and Zilpah, give birth to eleven sons and one daughter. (29:31-30:24)
- Jacob and his family leave Laban's household with great wealth. (31:1-32:3)
