This week's parashah is Shemot. Shemot is the first parashah of the eponymous second Book of Moses. (That is how the system works.) Shemot—better known to us as Exodus—actually begins with a list of names (shem=name; shemot=names). These are the names of Jacob's sons who were welcomed into the land of Egypt, however short-lived that welcome was. Moses is born, survives infancy against all odds, thrives, kills, escapes, marries, returns with a mission. An eventful week for sure.
