

The 3 larger cornices are about 24x12x5.5 inches. The one smaller is 16x10x4 in. They all have some missing parts but for being 150 years old, they are in nice shape. Two of the larger ones have been varnished. The other two are just stripped.

People talk of keeping up and restoring old buildings. These are from an historic building, the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Queen City Station, in Cumberland Md, that could not be saved. The proceeds from the sale will help keep B'er Chayim's almost 170 old building an active historic structure.
