High Holy Days are soon to be visible on the far horizon. Who would like to prepare a Torah, Haftarah, or perhaps a Hebrew reading for the upcoming High Holy Days? I'll be happy to help. You can lose at bridge and golf, but never in Torah.

Yesterday, I heard from Gate1 Travel (gate1travel.com). They quoted a price based on a February 18, 2023 departure. The land price is \$2489 per person, double occupancy with an estimated airfare from Washington Dulles of \$1219 per person. Fifteen participants are required for this price. Included are nine nights of First Class accommodations, four nights in Jerusalem, one night at the Dead Sea, two nights in the Galilee, two nights in Tel Aviv, hotel porterage, transfers, and 16 meals (nine breakfasts and seven dinners). Sightseeing is by modern air-conditioned motor coach. This is the Classic Tour as described in this link.

The Baltimore-based alternative I mentioned earlier has a land-only package price of around \$4,000-\$4,500 depending upon choices of hotels and excursions. I asked for mid-high quality hotels. Not five stars, but four-plus. Breakfasts are included, as well as a Shabbat meal. Everything is adjustable, as it is a private tour. Fifteen is also the minimum, but it would be a private group (with a smaller bus). There are choices.

I look forward to seeing everyone soon in the Temple or on Zoom on Saturday at 10:00 am for the reading of Parashat Korach.

This Week's Torah Portion

Korach

קרח

Numbers 16:1-18:32

Summary:

- Korach and his followers, Dathan and Abiram, lead a rebellion against the leadership of Moses and Aaron. God punishes the rebels by burying them and their families alive. Once again, God brings a plague on the people. (16:1-17:15)
- The chief of each tribe deposits his staff inside the Tent of Meeting. Aaron's staff brings forth sprouts, produces blossoms, and bears almonds. (17:16-26)
- The Kohanim and Levites are established and assigned the responsibility of managing the donations to the Sanctuary. All of the firstborn offerings shall go to the priests and all the tithes are designated for the Levites in return for the services they perform. (18:1-32)
