Parashat Chukat is one of the most enigmatic readings of the year. Some events are straightforward; such as Moses' rock-bashing lack of control, Aaron's complicity, the general nastiness of the Amalekites and the Emorites, Jews complaining about food yet again (proving that "eating to live" is a better choice than "living to eat"), and two notable deaths thrown in the mix. Of course, the most interesting part of Chukat happens in the beginning with laws pertaining to the red heifer.

A parah adumah (red heifer) is needed for required purification and not easily found. The implications for us today are many. How we are able to negotiate these spiritually treacherous waters is open to question. Maybe by Friday, we'll have some answers.

This Week's Torah Portion

Chukat

חַקת

The Ritual Law

Numbers 19:1-22:1

- Summary: The laws of the red heifer to purify a person who has had contact with a corpse are given. (19:1-22)
- The people arrive at the wilderness of Zin. Miriam dies and is buried there. (20:1)
- The people complain that they have no water. Moses strikes the rock to get water for them. God tells Moses and Aaron they will not enter the Land of Israel. (20:2-13)
- The king of Edom refuses to let the Children of Israel pass through his land. After Aaron's priestly garments are given to his son Eleazer, Aaron dies. (20:14-29)
- After they are punished for complaining about the lack of bread and water, the Israelites repent and are victorious in battle against the Amorites and the people of Bashan, whose lands they capture. (21:4-22:1)
